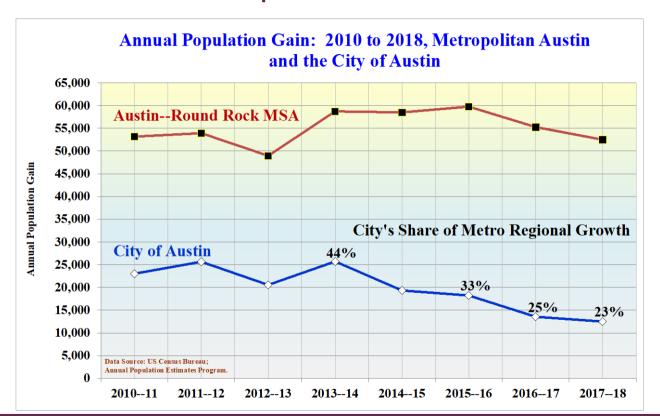

Austin/MSA Population Growth

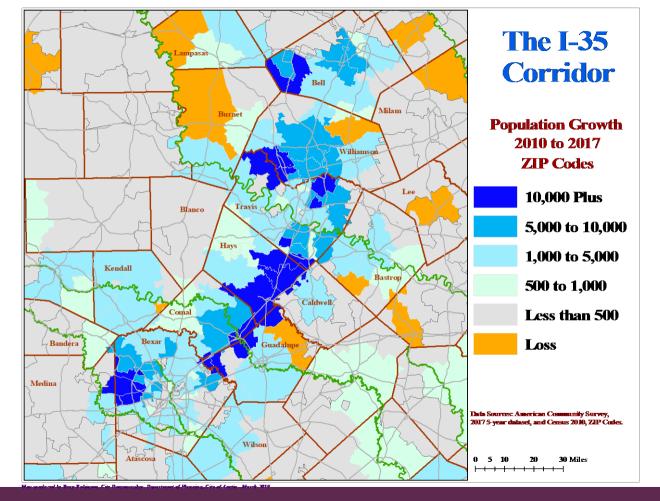




















Economic Factors

 - Monthly income for family of four at poverty level: \$2,183



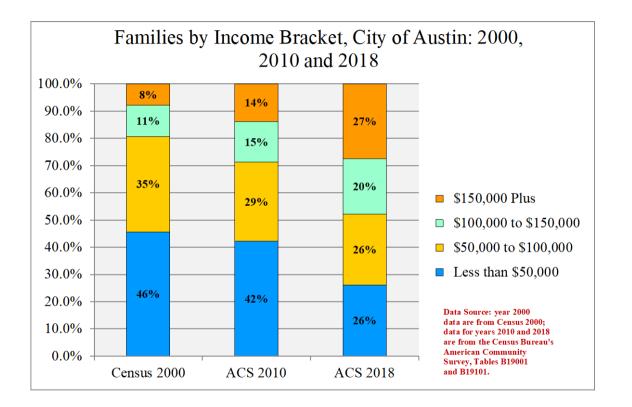








Household Incomes





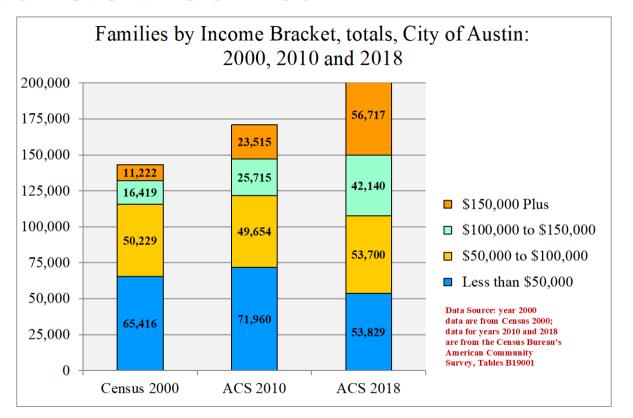

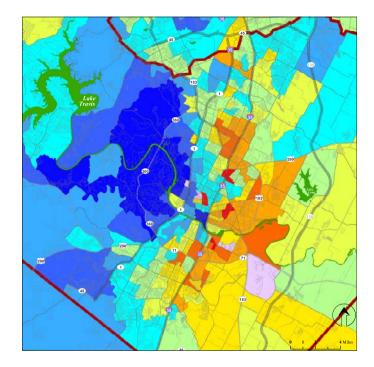

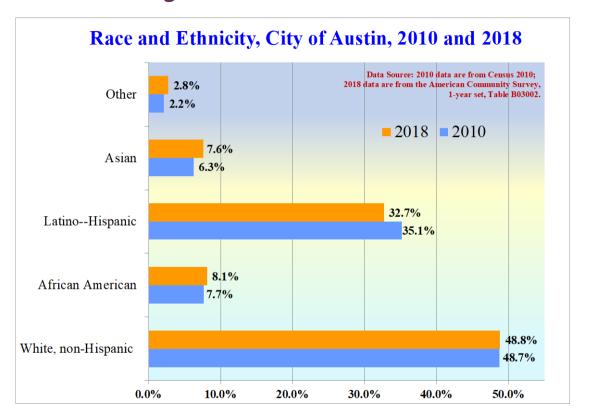








Race/Ethnicity

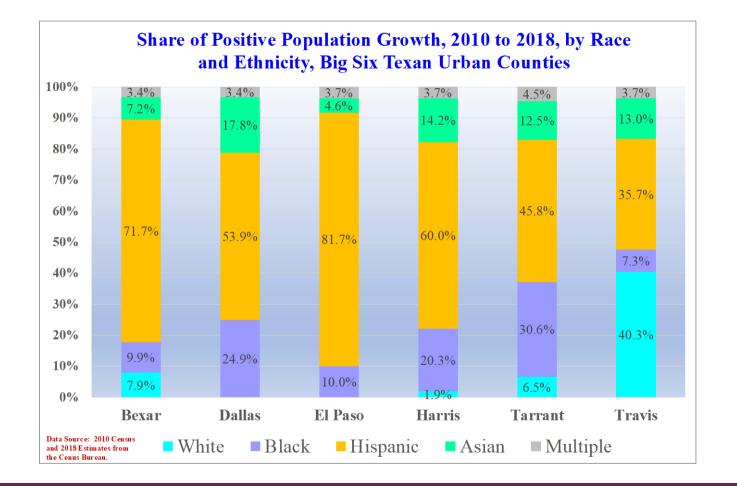












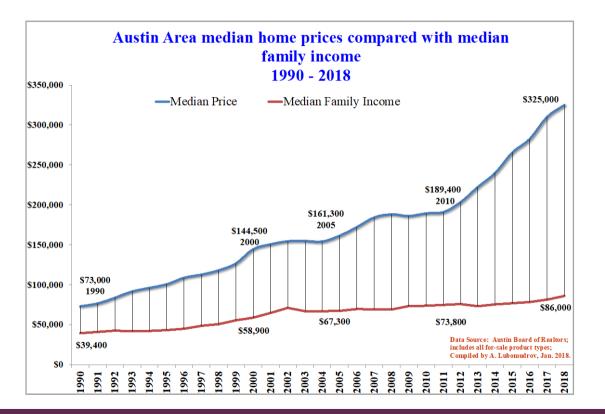








Housing Prices—Austin/Round Rock MSA

- White population has highest rate of growth



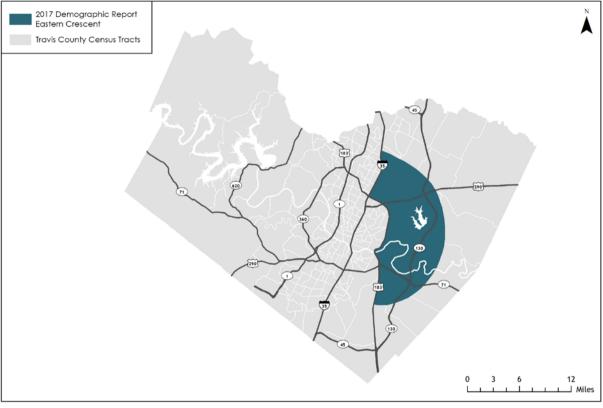








Approximation of the Eastern Crescent Boundary

Shown is the approximation of the "Eastern Crescent" - which is a 1 term that is commonly used when describing displacement amongst low-income communities in Travis County.



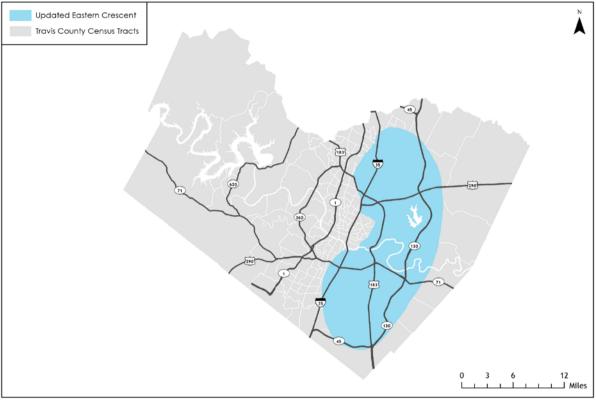








Approximation of the Eastern Crescent Boundary

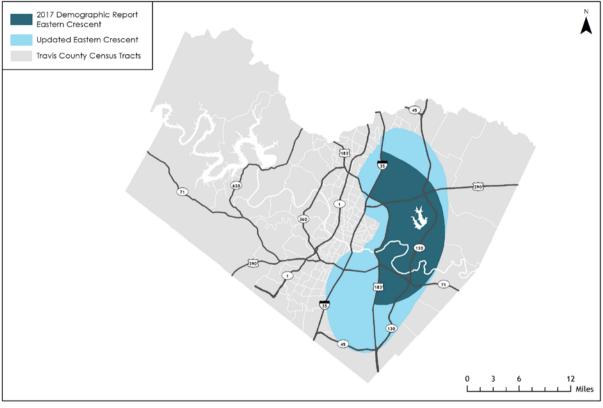








Approximation of the Eastern Crescent Boundary

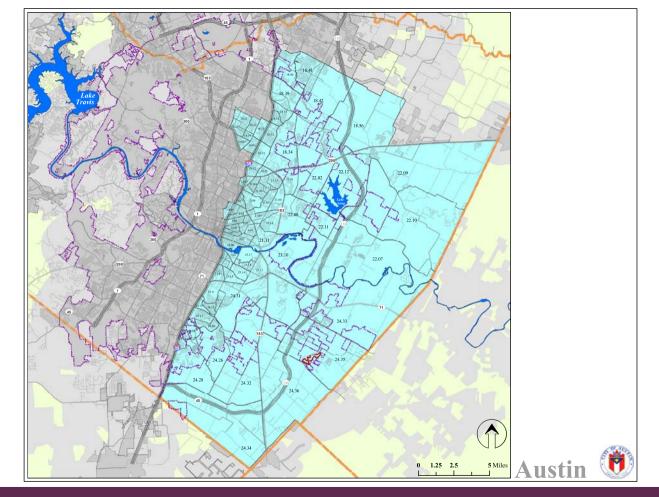

2. Discuss the development of dashboards and other reporting tools on specific focus areas and strategic objectives.

Clerk's Notes: Discussion on this item began at 4:31 p.m. Mr. JP Eichmiller, Senior Director of Strategy and Information Design and Ms. Sarita Clark-Leach, Director of Analytics and Reporting presented on the Central Health Dashboard Menu. They explained that the purpose of this item is to provide guidance to Central Health staff regarding the development of dashboards and to set the schedule and frequency of presentation to the Central Health Board of Managers. Mr. Eichmiller and Ms. Clark-Leach presented the proposed dashboard items that they would like to present to the Board, which included services reporting, demographic and geographic overviews, patient populations and gap analysis, and budget and financial indicators.

No action was taken on item 2.

3. Discuss and take appropriate action on the Strategic Planning Committee meeting schedule and on the scope of work and future agenda items for the Strategic Planning Committee and Eastern Crescent Subcommittee during Fiscal Year 2020.

Clerk's Notes: Discussion on this item began at 4:55 p.m. Chairperson Bell discussed with Managers when the best time and dates for the Strategic Planning Committee to meet would be. The Committee members all advised that the Strategic Planning Committee should meet every second Wednesday of the month at 1 p.m. following the Eastern Crescent Subcommittee Meeting, which will begin at 12 p.m.

Manager Jones explained that he discussed some questions with Managers, including what the definition of Eastern Crescent would be, what the defined geographical area would consist of, what population/demographics make up the area, what percentage of the total client population of Central Health patients live in the Eastern Crescent, and what the total population of the Eastern Crescent is. Manager Jones explained that Managers may send Central Health staff what they would like to see in the scope of the Eastern Crescent Subcommittee before the next meeting.

5. Discuss an update on Communications and Community Engagement activities and initiatives.

Clerk's Notes: Discussion on this item began at 5:06 p.m. Mr. Ivan Davila, Director of Communications & Community Engagement and Isela Guerra, Community Outreach Supervisor presented on the Community Outreach Pilot. They explained that the goal is to increase use of clinical services in sites with low utilization rates in priority areas including Colony Park, Hornsby Bend, and Southeast Travis County. They discussed how the strategy they are using to reach this goal is utilizing Community Health Workers. They also gave a breakdown of how long contracted community health workers have been helping in this effort, the number of people they have reached, the number of referrals, and the number of Way to Wellness Workshops they have helped with. Finally, they discussed next steps, which include a proposal to hire community outreach specialists in-house, work with CommUnityCare to establish a process to make clinical appointments on behalf of residents in priority areas, work with the Eligibility Department to train community outreach specialists to submit MAP/MAP BASIC applications on behalf of residents in priority areas, and as utilization rates are deemed appropriate, shift focus to health promotions to improve health outcomes by priority area.

Re: Naming system and branding initiative

BACKGROUND

In January 2018, an independent consultant – Germane Solutions – released a performance review of Central Health, offering a third-party perspective on the strengths and weaknesses of the healthcare district, as compared to peer organizations in Texas and select regions in the United States. The performance review found there is confusion amongst the public regarding how the Central Health Enterprise works together, and the value it brings to the community.

In the spring of 2019, Central Health Communications began an initiative to understand community and stakeholder perceptions of the Enterprise, and create strategic, researched-based naming system options that would lessen confusion among constituents and better connect the Enterprise affiliates for patients, partners, community members and employees.

Following months or research and testing, we are approaching the final stage of the Central Health Enterprise naming and branding initiative. To date we have completed:

- Peer research
- Stakeholder interviews
- Creative brief development
- Name architecture concepting
- Perception and awareness survey
- Focus groups
- Creative development for names and logos

To date, Central Health communications and Belmont Icehouse, the consultant assisting with this project, have met with the Central Health Strategic Planning Committee (MIKE CAN YOU CHECK HOW MANY TIMES – I THINK 3), executives and board members at CommUnityCare, as well as Enterprise Communications Working Group.

ACTION

At this time, we are asking the Board of Managers Strategic Planning Committee to provide feedback on the two design options and direction on the next steps. We do anticipate returning to the CommUnityCare Board of Directors to offer an opportunity for additional feedback before presenting a final recommended design to the full Board of Managers for implementation. At that time, we also anticipate providing more information on the implementation plan.

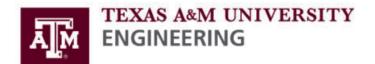

Stakeholder Interviews

Understand the perceptions and awareness of our stakeholders regarding the Enterprise.

- Performed 24 interviews with executives, board members, community members and patients
- English and Spanish
- In-person, over the phone or written depending on the participants preference and availability
- Some key takeaways:
 - Most stakeholders agree that while Central Health is improving the health of the community;
 there is confusion within Travis County of how the affiliates work together.
 - Stakeholders are generally open to a name change in order to improve transparency and create a more consistent and efficient way to connect people to care and coverage.



Online Survey (July)

Travis County residents, 18 and older, representative of demographics (U.S. Census).

- General awareness CommUnityCare 35%; MAP 27%; Central Health 14%
- Current patients CommUnityCare 76%; MAP 61%; Central Health 33%
- Favorability toward organizations MAP 85%; CommUnityCare 82%;
 Central Health 80%; Sendero 70%
- Included brand awareness of other well known, regional health care brands, including St. David's Healthcare 82%; Seton 79%; and Planned Parenthood 78%



Focus Groups (September)

- English, Spanish, and bilingual
- Most participants supported a name change CommUnityCare was preferred
- Key Takeaways:
 - Consistent with the Quantitative survey, current patients had higher awareness of, and interaction with, the Central Health Enterprise than non-patients.
 - Consistent with the Germane Solutions report, all groups (including employees) felt that the community is confused surrounding the Enterprise as a whole, how the organizations work together and what is offered.
 - CommUnityCare had significantly higher awareness and interaction level than Central Health, and participants felt a stronger affinity to the organization due to their interaction and understanding of what the organization provides for them and the community.
 - All 5 groups gravitated to CommUnityCare of Travis County/CommUnityCare Health Centers, as they liked the use of Community and felt that it created the best cohesion.
 - There were mixed emotions towards the inclusion of "Travis" or "Travis County," with the Spanish-speaking groups having a more negative feeling towards it as it felt exclusive and could limit future care.
